ADULTS WITH DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES AND DEMENTIA

This presentation addresses the unique challenges of supporting adults with developmental disabilities and dementia. Participants will learn about dementia's symptoms, risk factors, and its overlap with developmental disabilities.

Emphasis will be placed on early detection, proactive support strategies, tailored communication skills, and the creation of supportive, person-centred environments.

Service providers will gain an understanding of the importance of advocacy and collaboration to improve care and support for this vulnerable population.

Person-centred planning focuses on an individual's strengths, needs, and goals to support choice, autonomy, and community inclusion. How can service providers support people to take control of their decisions and live in ways that reflect their values?

Building on our Inclusive Framework and Collaborative Care workshops, this session explores how to support vulnerable populations by:

- Building autonomy in daily living
- Supporting self-advocacy and awareness of rights
- Encouraging meaningful input into decisions that affect their lives

Service providers will learn how to balance appropriate support while ensuring individuals maintain control over their own choices.
